Wind Farm Update

It's been an interesting couple of months at the Gunning Wind Farm since NSW went into lockdown in the middle of this year.

Many of our lives were put on hold during this period, however the demand for energy does not stop and so the Gunning Wind Farm was business as usual to ensure the turbines kept spinning.

The COVID19 lockdowns have brought challenges to the operations of the wind farm. The new government rules and restrictions impacted the availability of people and contractors that would usually travel to and from the wind farm. Many of the contractors that work on our Gunning Wind Farm are Sydney-based and were no longer able to travel to the wind farm. This has meant some routine and planned works had to be postponed.

Additionally. our Gunning Wind site manager and sole ACCIONA Energía representative in NSW, Craig Simon, has not had the support of any Melbourne or Brisbane staff at the Wind Farm because of the interstate border restrictions. During this time, Craig has had some staff changes with turbine technicians from Australian Wind Services, and has spent much of this period training new technicians who are recent recruits to the renewable energy industry.

The lack of availability of staff and contractors has made it really important that staff at the wind farm maintain safety and hygiene protocols to avoid the spread of COVID-19. Along with routine hand-washing and mask-wearing, the technicians have adopted new ways of doing things, including only sending one person up the turbine lift at a time instead of two.

Craig has managed exceptionally well, maintaining the spirits of himself and the turbine technicians during this time. The team has worked closely together, supporting and looking after each other, and they are excited that life at the wind farm is beginning to return back to

We also have continued to support our local community during this time with ongoing community sponsorships and funding for local projects and programs. These community projects and programs are so important to the community, now more than ever.

We hope you are all as excited as we are to see NSW beginning to open up again and enjoy the newsletter update!

2021 Scholarship Recipient

Recently we asked Thomas some questions about his career goals and learned about how the scholarship has directly benefited him.

What do you want to do in your career? I would like to pursue a career in international relations and diplomacy. I seek to gain a position in an international institution addressing pressing problems faced by Australia and the global community.

What does climate change and renewable energy mean to you? I see climate change as posing both a great threat, and an important opportunity to both Australia and the international community. The dangers posed by climate change are immense, however we can utilise such threats to foster innovation and cooperation worldwide. I believe renewable energy will become vital in the global attempt to arrest climate change and protect our future.

The funding provided to the Gunning District and Health Services was used to purchase two new defibrillators for the Gunning community. One of the defibrillators replaced the current older model defibrillator that is located at the Gunning Courthouse Building.

The second defibrillator was purchased so that Gunning had access to a second defibrillator. This new defibrillator is located at the Gunning District and Health Services' second office in Warrataw Street, at the Tony Foley Memorial Centre.

The older model defibrillator that was replaced was given to the Gunning Early Learning Centre as they required a defibrillator for their accreditation purposes.

The Gunning District and Health Services recently thanked us for our funding and acknowledged that these necessary improvements could not have been done without the financial assistance of ACCIONA Energía.

We thank the Gunning District and Health Service for participating in our sponsorship program, and for the work they do supporting the Gunning community.

Sustainable Development Goals

ACCIONA Energía is committed to contributing to the UN's Sustainable Development Goals. Here are some of the ways we contribute:

#SDG8 - The world is facing a slowing of global economic growth and will face the worst economic recession since the great depression caused by the COVID19 pandemic. At ACCIONA Energía, our projects help combat this slowed economic growth by creating more jobs. Our new MacIntyre wind farm in Queensland will create approximately 500 direct jobs during construction and a further 20-30 operations jobs during the entire life cycle of the project. It is also estimated that this project will contribute 1,737 million AUD to Australia's GDP.

#SDG9 - At ACCIONA Energía we believe in innovation, and that's why we are investing in the Asia Pacific Renewable Energy Tech-Transition Centre (APRETC), which will be built in Ballarat at Federation University Australia. The training centre is the first in Australia to have a simulated wind turbine and offer the Global Wind Organisation basic safety training.
